Symbolic tree planting at the North Pole marks the start of "Expedition Hope"

(Barneo, Arctic, 4 April, 2014) Felix (16) marked the beginning of the 50+-day expedition from the North Pole to Canada by symbolically planting a tree. Starting today, the polar explorers Bernice Notenboom, Martin Hartley und Eric Philips will cover a distance of approximately 20 km on a daily basis to renew public awareness of the climate crisis. With this expedition, the explorers are supporting the children of Plant-for-the-Planet, who have been fighting for climate justice and their future since 2007.

The expedition shall show the disastrous effects the melting of the Arctic ice shield will have. Felix Finkbeiner: "It's not about the polar bear, it's about the world climate losing its refrigerator. Some are happy about the meltdown since it'll open up the sea bottom for oil drilling – something which will once and for all destroy the future of us children. We ask everybody to plant trees! Capture the dangerous greenhouse gas CO2".

About Plant-for-the-Planet:

The Plant-for-the-Planet Children and Youth Initiative was initiated in January 2007 and originated from a school report on the climate crisis by Felix Finkbeiner, then 9 years old. At the end of his presentation, Felix put forward the vision that children could plant one million trees in every country in the world to balance carbon emissions. In the years that followed, Plant-for-the-Planet evolved into a global movement. Today, thousands of children across the world are committed to the goal. The movement understands its role as being an initiative of world citizens who are committed to climate justice in the sense of achieving an overall reduction of greenhouse gas emissions and a unified distribution of these emissions among all of humankind.

Plant-for-the-Planet has had democratic structure since March 2011. It has two elected Global Boards, one for the children aged 8-14, and one for the youth aged 15-21; each consists of 14 children with representatives from 8 world regions.

Since the children took over responsibility for the Billion Tree Campaign from UNEP in 2011, the children have set themselves a new goal of planting 1,000 billion trees worldwide by 2020. With such a giant CO2 storage facility, 10 billion tons of CO2 could be offset, buying us valuable time to permanently reduce our CO2 emissions (one tree can bind, on average, 10 kg of CO2 per year). If every global citizen plants 150 trees by 2020, then this goal will be met. So far almost 13 billion trees have been planted across 193 countries.
